Preface 😭

One year has already passed since the invasion to Ukraine by Russia, which started on February 24th, 2022. The number of "evacuees" who crossed the border from Ukraine, has reached 2,000,000 people (UNHCR, April 11th, 2023), and 2,384 people have arrived in Japan as of April 12th, 2023 (Immigration Services Agency of Japan, April 14th, 2023). Since then, there has been no sign of cease fire, devastating scale of damage to various infrastructure. It's hard to imagine how long will it take for evacuees to be able to return home and recover.

In such situation, us, Peace Winds Japan have been supporting Ukrainian evacuees in Japan with pets, who are treated as precious family members. Japan is a Rabies-free country which is very rare (only six countries and areas all over the world are claimed to be). Maintaining this status requires a series of procedures and a long-term quarantine. To make these procedures clear and visual, we decided to publish this guidebook, with a great support from the Pro Bono team.

Peace Winds Japan is an NGO born in Japan in 1996, and has been actively implementing projects in 36 countries and areas around the world. We are the ones to be on the ground and start supporting, as soon as possible, those who suffered from humanitarian crisis and natural disasters. We wholeheartedly hope the evacuees stay in Japan safely and peacefully, and the cease fire will be concluded at the earliest moment.

Preparation and Procedures for Entering and Living in Japan


Timeline overview

Since 1950, when the Rabies Prevention Law was enacted, Japan has succeeded in eliminating rabies by thoroughly enforcing dog registration, vaccination, and internment of wild dogs and other animals. As a result, there have been no outbreaks of rabies in Japan, including dogs.

However, since rabies still occurs in most parts of the world, Japan places great emphasis on measures to be taken in case of an outbreak. Therefore, for dogs and cats imported into Japan, prudent preparation and procedures are required prior to entry into Japan.


Import inspections for dogs and cats that are found to meet import requirements are completed in a short time (within 12 hours). On the other hand, if the pet does not meet the import requirements, it will be subject to a quarantine inspection at a detention facility of the Animal Quarantine Service for up to 180 days, or returned at the importer's own expense.

In order to ensure that pets, as members of the family, can safely come to Japan with their owners, we have described the flow of the procedural process on the following pages. The timeline below is an overview of the process.






Microchip Implanting and 1st Rabies Vaccination






2nd Rabies Vaccination and Rabies Antibody Test






Advance Notification to the Animal Quarantine Service






Preparation of Quarantine Inspection at Detention






Import Inspection of Pets After Arrival






Quarantine Inspection at Detention Facility


